



### K-12 Committee Formation



- Our K-12 Outreach events are some of the largest events we run as a chapter
  - Eg. Cub Scouts Day, Merit Badge Day, MindSET
- These events are currently organized by a very small group of people
  - Makes it difficult on the organizers to effectively organize
  - Could lead to knowledge loss once these organizers graduate/leave
- Solution: Form a committee to aid in the planning and execution of K-12 events.

# Motion: K-12 Committee (Part 1)



- Add the following to Appendix G.2
  - K-12 OUTREACH COMMITTEE This committee, which shall be part of the Events Team, consists of the Service Coordinator and K-12 Outreach Officers, who shall co-chair the committee and may appoint additional committee members by majority vote of the three officers. K12-related Chairs shall serve as non-voting members of the Committee. All chairs reporting to the K-12 officers shall serve as members of the committee. The Committee will serve to assist the K-12 Outreach Officers in coordinating, executing, and transferring knowledge regarding the K-12 Outreach efforts of the chapter. This committee is responsible for training all volunteers at chapter-sponsored events in responsible conduct around minors as well as other requirements as set by the University or the chapter. Any chapter-sponsored event featuring youth requires the Committee preapproval, and must be co-led by at least one member of the committee. This Committee must meet at least once per month, and publicly document their meeting minutes.
- Update Section I.5.b as follows, where green text indicates an addition:
  - (b) STANDING COMMITTEES The standing committees are the Professional Development Committee, Website Committee, Book Swap Committee, K-12 Outreach Committee and Group Leaders Committee. The membership and duties of each are listed in Appendix G.2.

# Motion: K-12 Committee (Part 2)



#### **ORIGINAL TEXT**

SECTION IV.4. K-12 OUTREACH OFFICER APPOINTMENT Both K-12 Outreach Officers will be appointed in the standard procedure, with the following modifications: (a) The interview committee will be the current president, the current Events Team lead, and the current K-12 Outreach Officer(s). (b) The reviewing committee will consist of the current President, the incoming President, the current Events Team lead(s), and the current K-12 Outreach Officers.

#### PROPOSED REVISION

- SECTION IV.4. K-12 OUTREACH OFFICER APPOINTMENT Both K-12 Outreach Officers will be appointed in the standard procedure, with the following modifications:
  - The reviewing and interviewing committee will consist of the current President, the incoming President, the current Events Team lead(s) and incoming Service Coordinators, and the current K-12 Outreach Officers. Other members of the K12 Outreach Committee, who are not running for the incoming K12 Outreach Officer position, shall be invited to join as non-voting members. The reviewing committee shall be chaired by the remaining K-12 Outreach Officer. Neither President may vote, except the current President in order to break a tie.
  - The interview committee will be the current president, the current Events Team lead, and the current K-12 Outreach Officer(s). At most three members of the interview committee may be physically present during an interview, and shall be chosen by majority vote of the reviewing committee. Of the members of the interview committee physically present, at least one must be a voting member of the K-12 Committee.

# Nondiscrimination Policy Overview

SECTION I.6. NONDISCRIMINATION The Michigan Gamma Chapter of Tau Beta Pi is committed to a policy of equal opportunity for all persons and does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, age, marital status, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, disability, religion, height, weight, or veteran status in its membership or activities unless permitted by university policy for gender specific organizations.

# **National Constitution Amendment**

## **Executive Council Election Process**



This amendment is designed to simplify the council election process in the following ways:

- 1) Reduce the number of times that a candidate might have to run in order to be elected
- 2) Require a majority of those voting, not a majority of all chapters represented at nationals

### **National Constitution Amendment**

#### Motion to Amend



SECTION 3. **Election.** (a) Elections for the Council shall occur annually for voting members whose terms expire prior to the next regular Convention, hereinafter referred to as open positions. All nominees who have not been elected to an open position on the Council shall be candidates for the open position in question. If a candidate receives a majority vote of the Convention, that candidate shall be elected to the open position in question. The election will be conducted using preferential (ranked choice) voting where each voting delegate will be provided a private ballot to rank each candidate for the Executive Council. The election may be conducted using an electronic voting system which allows for preferential voting. If no candidate receives a majority, the candidate receiving the fewest votes shall be dropped from further consideration for the open position in question. Voting shall be repeated until all open positions are filled. The numerical results of the voting each ballot shall be made known to the Convention before any subsequent ballots are cast. Should an unopposed candidate not receive a majority vote of the Convention for an open position, nominations from the floor will be accepted and elections shall follow the procedure above. The unopposed candidate is ineligible for further

## THE ELIGIBILITY CODE OF THE TAU BETA PI ASSOCIATION (Adopted by the 1926 Convention)

In order that there may be a more uniform basis for selection of members for Tau Beta Pi, these suggestions are offered. It is expected that a copy of this statement be given each active member before every election, and it may at times serve as a general expression of our policy in the selection of members.

It is the purpose of the Society to mark in a fitting manner those who have conferred honor upon their alma mater by distinguished scholarship and exemplary character as students, or by their attainments as alumni.



## THE ELIGIBILITY CODE OF THE TAU BETA PI ASSOCIATION (Adopted by the 1926 Convention)

Distinguished scholarship, while the primary requisite for admission, must not be considered the sole criterion.

After the scholastic requirements have been fulfilled, the selection shall be based on integrity, breadth of interest both inside and outside of engineering, adaptability, and unselfish activity.

## THE ELIGIBILITY CODE OF THE TAU BETA PI ASSOCIATION (Adopted by the 1926 Convention)

. . .

We consider that true integrity is the sine qua non for membership in Tau Beta Pi, that it transcends in importance scholarship, activity, and every other qualification. Without private and public integrity, we believe that no organization is worthy of existence. Under integrity, we include honor and high standards of truth and justice.

Breadth of interest sufficient for eligibility in this Association will enable people to maintain their positions in their community by the exercise of qualities other than engineering ability.

## THE ELIGIBILITY CODE OF THE TAU BETA PI ASSOCIATION (Adopted by the 1926 Convention)

...

True engineers must be able to adapt themselves ingeniously to all circumstances and conditions, making them conform to the desired purpose.

The rating of people on the degree of unselfish activity manifested, is intended to indicate that Tau Beta Pi believes that none can become worthy engineers without the welfare of associates, organizations, and the community at heart.

## THE ELIGIBILITY CODE OF THE TAU BETA PI ASSOCIATION (Adopted by the 1926 Convention)

It is furthermore expected that they display willingness to aid and assist in worthy causes by their actual campus record. However, the fact that people may not have shown unselfish activity to an appreciable degree throughout their courses of study is no infallible indication that they would not if the opportunity offered. The most conspicuous illustrations of this are those students who are self supporting, for which due allowance must be made and due credit given.

In fine, it is in this capacity for the unstinted giving of their best, without thought of remuneration, that we believe lies one of the most sensitive tests for determining candidates' rights to bear the name and wear the Bent of Tau Beta Pi.
