



References to the Constitution of TBP's National Organization (constitution)



SECTION I.4. TERMINOLOGY This Constitution, together with any Bylaws enacted by the chapter, will collectively serve the role of chapter Bylaws as prescribed in C-VII,4C-VI, 5 of the Constitution of the Association.

voting meeting. Any active member may attend and vote. Quorum for chapter activities is defined by C-VII,6 of the Constitution of the Association Bylaw 5.07 of the Association.

SECTION III.4. OFFICES The chapter must maintain, at a minimum, those officers prescribed in C-VII,8C-VI,6 of the Constitution of the Association. Additional officers may be prescribed by the chapter Bylaws. The chapter Bylaws may additionally combine officers listed in C-VII,8C-VI,6 of the Constitution of the Association, provided that the necessitated responsibilities are still provided for.

SECTION III.7. REMOVAL Officers may be removed from office at the pleasure of the membership as provided for in the Bylaws or in the parliamentary authority (See C-XIV,7Const. Art. XIV, Sec. 7) adopted by the Association.

SECTION IV.1. DEFINITION The chapter membership consists of those persons so defined by C-VII,1C-VI,1 of the Constitution of the Association.

SECTION IV.2. ELIGIBILITY OF NEW MEMBERS In addition to the requirements in C-II of the Constitution of the AssociationC-VIII of the Constitution of the Association, candidates must meet the following requirements:

SECTION IV.3. PROCESS The process for joining is referred to as the election process. The requirements and process for joining consist of those requirements and items outlined in C-IIIC-VIII and Bylaw VI of the Association, and in the chapter Bylaws.

SECTION IV.4. REMOVAL The process for removing a member from membership is defined in C-I,5 of the Constitution of the Associationthe Constitution of the Tau Beta Pi Association, in Article IX, Section 5.

Historian, Publicity Officer, and all ad hoc officers listed in Appendix F.4. All officers must be members. In addition to the duties specified in the C-VII,10 of the Constitution of the Association Tau Beta Pi Association Bylaws 5.03, the duties described in Appendix F are required of the officers.

SECTION I.2. ADVISORS The chapter must maintain a minimum of four advisors, as stipulated in C-VII,11C-VI,7 of the Constitution of the Tau Beta Pi Association. An advisor

- (c) Interviews must be conducted. The interviewers will be the current president and EVPs. In the event any interviewer is an applicant or otherwise unable to attend an interview, or is himself/herself an applicant, a substitute will be determined by the interviewers.
- (d) The reviewing committee will be the current President, Vice President, Secretary, and both EVPs. In the event that any members of this committee apply for EVP, they will be recused from the decision. The first vacancy will be filled by the Treasurer, unless the Treasurer has also appliedhe/she applies for EVP. Any remaining vacancies will be filled by advisors.

SECTION VIII.3. TRACKING STATUS Active status is evaluated by the Membership Officer. If an inactive member satisfies the above requirement mid-semester, theyhe/she can also be made active immediately upon request.

SECTION III.5. TERM LENGTH Advisor term length will be subject to motion from the floor as part of the election proceedings. An advisor candidate must indicate theirhis/her preferred term length, and cannot be elected to a term longer than that. The maximum length for an individual term is three years. The term length is considered part of the motion to elect and therefore may be amended by the body. If an advisor fails to receive a majority of votes cast, a motion may be made to elect themhim/her to a shorter term, to a minimum of one semester.

SECTION VIII.1. ACHIEVING ACTIVE STATUS To achieve active status for the current semester, a Michigan Gamma Tau Beta Pi member must satisfy one of the following:

- (a) Be an officer, Distinguished Active, or Prestigious Active,
- (b) Have initiated into the society in the current semester, or,
- (c) Achieve a sufficient level of activity in the society, as defined by the following requirements:
 - Attend, at a minimum, two meetings, both of which must be voting meetings (2nd Actives, 3rd Actives or Officer Elections),
 - (ii) Complete two hours of TBP-sponsored service, and
 - (iii) Attend at least one social event or serve as a mentor in the chapter mentorship program.



Interview structure



- 1. Sign up for the interview on the website (beforehand)
- 2. Read the electee questionnaire responses (beforehand)
- 3. Meet the electee, introduce yourselves
- 4. Chit-chat for a bit, get to know each other
- 5. Talk about electee questionnaire responses (website)
- 6. Go over the case study
- 7. Fill out the evaluation form (website)

Interview prep



- interview materials will be in the room when you get there
- Attire is business casual for you, business formal for electees
- More info and a reminder coming out before the interview
 - Includes instructions for navigating the website

Interview tips



Friendliness and gentle questioning/encouragement is effective!

 Be nice to the electee and remind them that the interview isn't supposed to be scary.

Don't get caught up on sticking to the "schedule"

Focus on learning about the electee, not following the outline.

Provide the correct materials to the electee

There are interviewer and electee versions of each!
