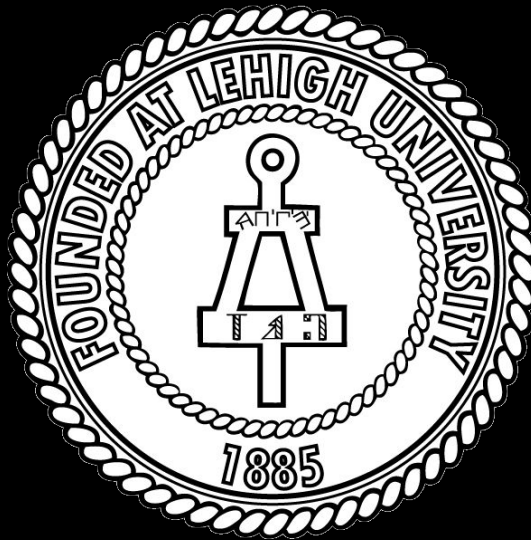

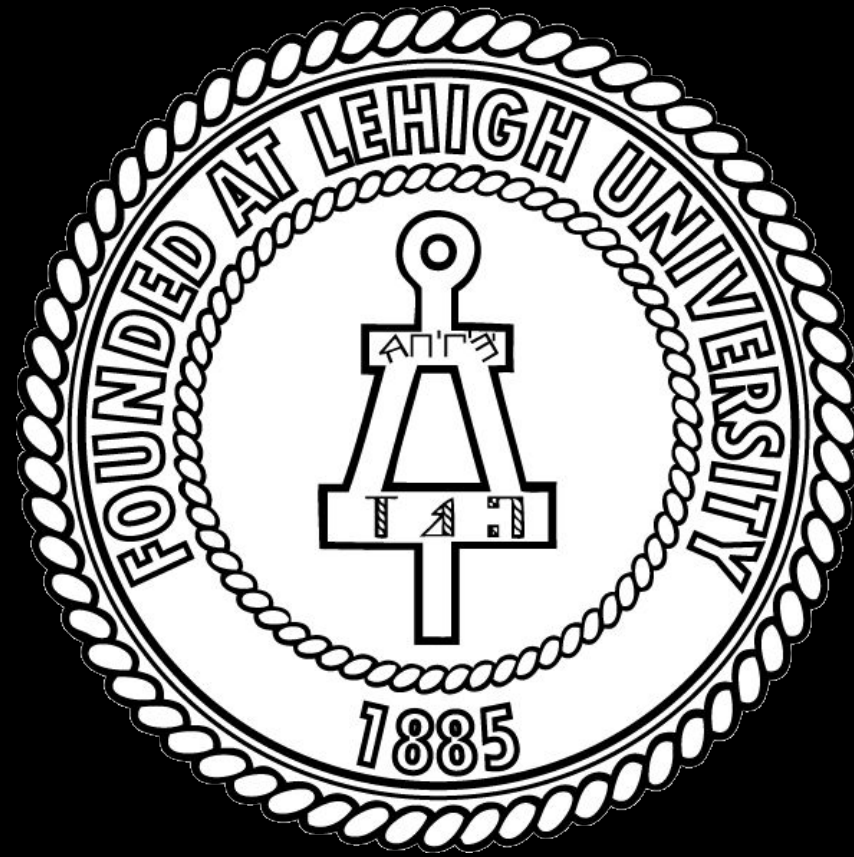

Membership in Tau Beta Pi



Eligibility requirements:

- Distinguished Scholarship
 - Assessed by GPA - top $\frac{1}{8}$ of junior class or top $\frac{1}{5}$ of senior class
- Exemplary Character
 - Assessed with a character interview and questionnaire



Undergraduate Initiation Requirements*

***All of these requirements can be met even if you are fully remote**

Requirement: Meetings



- Attendance at **all (3) General meetings + Elections**
 - Electees with valid conflicts may use additional service hours to fill this requirement

- Meeting Dates:
 - First General - Sept 22
 - Second General - Oct 6
 - Third General - Nov 17
 - Elections - Dec 1



Requirement: Service



- Completion of **7 total hours of service**
 - 1 hour Tutoring
 - 2 K-12 Outreach events



Requirement: Social & Prof. Dev.



- Attendance of 4 PD/Social Events
- A minimum of **1 social event** is required for initiation
 - These are fun, most of the time free food is provided!
 - In the past, these have included:
 - Intramural Sports teams
 - TGs at BWW i.e. Free wings at Buffalo Wild Wings
 - Game Nights
- A minimum of **1 professional development event** is also required
 - In the past, these have included:
 - TBP sponsored Corporate Information Sessions
 - North Campus Sustainability Hour talks (free food!)
 - TBP sponsored Professional Headshots



Requirement: Electee Team Activities



- Attendance at **three meetings of your Electee Team**
 - Events:
 - Peer Interview/Coffee Chats
 - Electee Exam
 - PowerPoint Party



Requirement: TBPals Program



- Attendance at **two meetings with your TBPals**
 - Groups of 3-4
 - Meet once before Oct 27th and a second time before Dec 1st
 - A great way to meet other members of TBP
 - Will be reimbursed up to \$10 a person for both meetings
 - More info from Allison tonight/tomorrow morning!



Requirement: Character Evaluation



- Completion of **Electee Questionnaire + Resume upload**
 - Due by Friday, September 25 at 11:59pm
 - Can only be done after making a website profile at tbp.engin.umich.edu

- Completion of in-person **Character Interview** with active Tau Bates
 - Will be held Sept 28 to Oct 2 via Zoom
 - 30 minutes long
 - Sign-up is on the website (tbp.engin.umich.edu)



Requirement: Paperwork & Dues



- Completion of low-pressure **Electee Exam** by Nov 3
 - Exam will be in documents sent out after this meeting and online
 - Knowledge of the history of Tau Beta Pi and the MI-G chapter
 - Don't take it too seriously! (Work with your electee team)
- Completion of **6 Casual Peer Interviews** by New Initiatives II
 - Interview fellow electees and actives to get to know one another
 - Also meant to be fun, like the exam! (don't take it too seriously)
- Payment of **\$100 one-time Membership Fee** by Third Gen
 - Paid to the Treasurer (Joe Rottner) - covers your national membership, personal engraved Bent, etc.



Requirement: Initiation

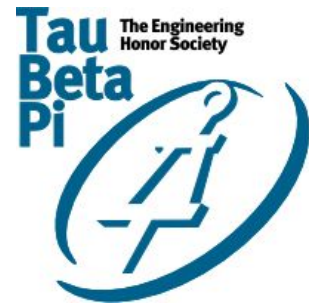


- Participation in an **Initiation Ceremony on Dec 5**
 - To become an active member of Tau Beta Pi, all electees must attend the Initiation Ceremony
 - If you are unable to attend Initiation on 12/5, alternate arrangements can be made for you to attend another chapter's initiation on a different date
