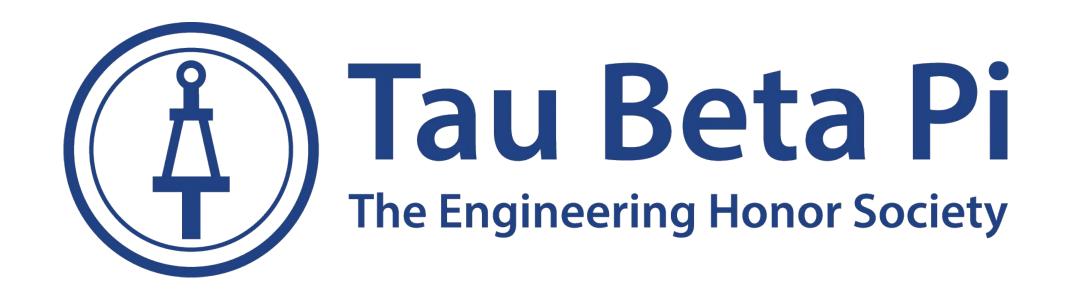

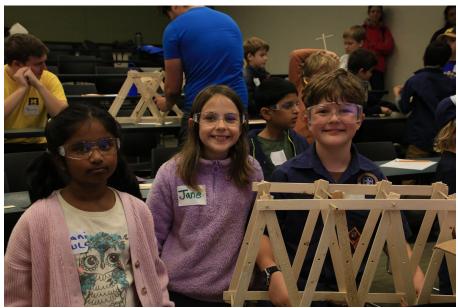


Cub Scout Day

Responsibilities:

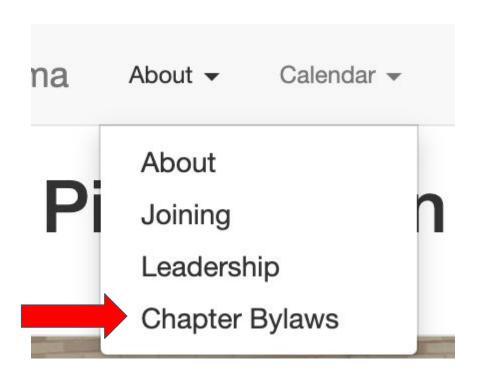
Corresponding Leader: Lexi Maxton, Activities Officer

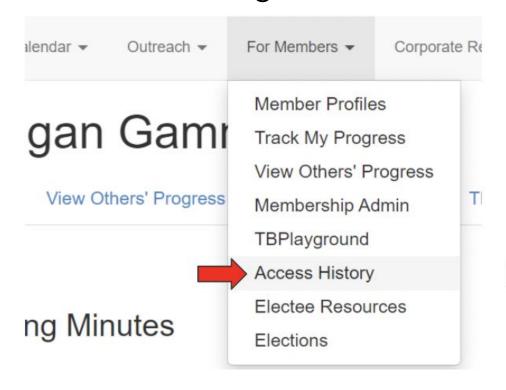
SWE/TBP Career Fair
