TOPICS:

1: Large new project:

Participants expanded upon ideas generated in the previous meeting. Reviving E-week was also discussed, and it was determined that it would not be a good idea because E-week was never very popular to begin with. Finally, participants continued to discuss the idea of holding a large design competition or engineering fair, however nothing concrete came of this.

2: Increasing Cornerstone Submissions:

Participants discussed how to increase article submissions to the cornerstone, the discussion notes taken follow.

Cornerstone Discussion

- Problem:

- Open Question: Who's cooler. Mike Hand or Kyle Lady

3: Increasing intersociety interaction:

- 4. Competitive event such as scavenger hunts, puzzle challenges

Related:

1. Ask TBP members what other organizations they belong to, and what sorts of events they would want to see. (email perhaps?)

During discussion, participants raised concerns that at the current intersociety events we hold, groups tend to not interact very much. Perhaps, before increasing the number of intersociety events we do, we need to find a way to increase interaction between groups at our current events. Additionally, intersociety events are not well-attended, so that should also be considered.
