





 - Committee Involvement






Cub Scouts Day

- Responsibilities:

 Reach out to parents/schools for participants
 Run the event (manage sign in, lead the module)
 Attend Monthly K-12 Committee Meetings
- Time Commitment:

 Preparing supplies: 1-2 hours
 Module development: varies, done asynchronously

- Committee members are either in or looking to be involved in some form of K-12 leadership
- Note: this position alone does not grant the leadership credit; you are encouraged to sign up for a chair position in one of our "signature events" (CSD, MBD, MindSET, Eng. Day)
- Responsibilities:
 - Attend K-12 Committee meetings to the best of your ability
 - Read and fill out the agenda prior to each meeting
 - Actively engage in discussion as well as other K-12 events
- Time Commitment:
 - ~2 hours/month

- (10 min) Apply to be a Service Project Lead and pick an event
- (15 min) Communicate with our contact via email to determine a time
- (15 min) Create an event on the website
- (90 min) Attend the event + transportation
- (10 min) Complete the project report

Total 👸: 140 minutes

Professional Development Project Leads


