Robert's Rules Refresher

All discussion flows through the chair.

No cross debate. Speak to the chair.

Make a *motion* if you'd like the body to do something.

e.g. *I move that we take a 5 minute bathroom break.*

Robert's Rules Refresher

We will be conducting two pieces of official business:

Reviewing a proposed bylaw change

Requires 50% + 1 of our active members to approve

Analyzing the exemplary character of our candidates

All members may debate and discuss.

Only active members may vote.

Bylaw Change: Chief Advisor

The Tau Beta Pi Association requires each chapter to elect a *chief advisor* who is a voting member of the advisory board and is responsible for signing various forms.

Our chapter has imposed a restriction that the chief advisor be a faculty member.

The intent for requiring the chief advisor to be a faculty member was to help facilitate our relationship with the University.

This assumes a small and inactive advisory board.

Many universities are unwilling to provide eligibility lists to students.

Bylaw Change: Chief Advisor

Our current bylaw doesn't specify the Chief Advisor's term.

The Association specifies that chapter advisors will have a 4-year term.

Our bylaws (which the Association has allowed) specify a 3-year term.

Traditionally we have elected our chief advisor to a 3-year term.

The bylaws are silent as to the intended term length for the Chief Advisor.

Bylaw Change: Chief Advisor

The proposal:

Remove the restriction that the chief advisor be a faculty member.

Specify the chapter's chief advisor term as 2-years (½ of the Association's 4-year term)

Bylaw Change: Chief Advisor

BYLAW SECTION I.2. ADVISORS The chapter must maintain a minimum of four advisors, as stipulated in C-VI,7 of the Constitution of the Tau Beta Pi Association. An advisor must be an initiated member of Tau Beta Pi. Additionally, advisors must be a faculty member, a national official, an alumni of MI-Γ with appropriate chapter experience, a graduate student with appropriate chapter experience, or a former chapter president. One of the advisors must serve as the chapter's Chief Advisor. This advisor will be selected by the advisors ~~and must be a faculty member.~~ **biannually for a two year term.** The advisors are responsible for ensuring chapter continuity.

Candidate Character Recommendation

Eligibility Code

Must be an active member (per Bylaw VIII) in order to vote

Please leave the room if you are not an initiated member of TBP

3/4th affirmative vote needed for candidate to be elected in

Abstention from voting is the same as a no vote.

All discussion is to be considered strictly confidential; nothing leaves this room

Candidate Character Recommendation

Discussion of a candidate will be limited to 10 minutes total.

Members are limited to 1 minute when speaking on a candidate

Discussion should be limited to concerns regarding a candidate's character.

Result of this meeting is a recommendation to Third Actives about a candidate's character.
