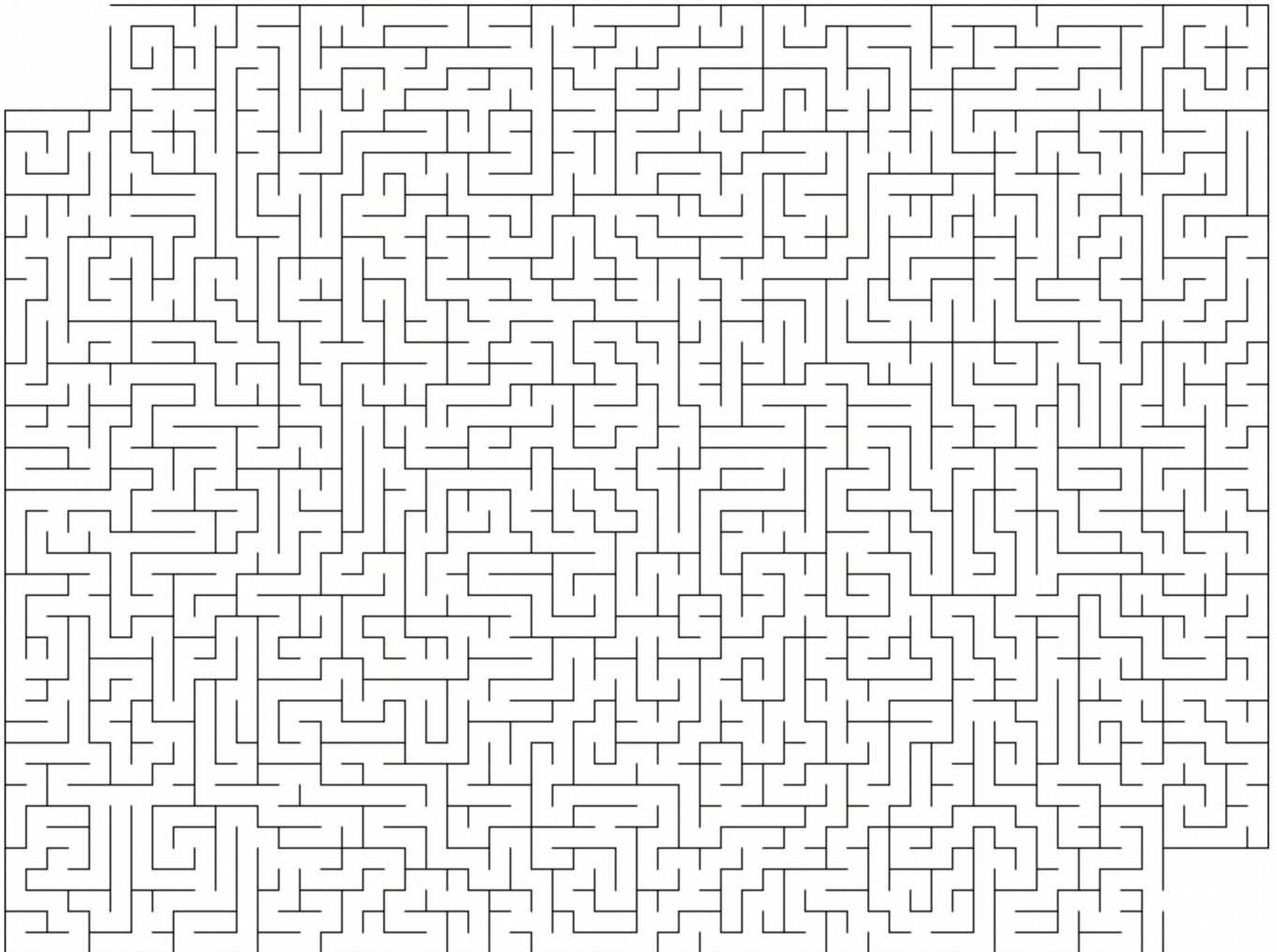
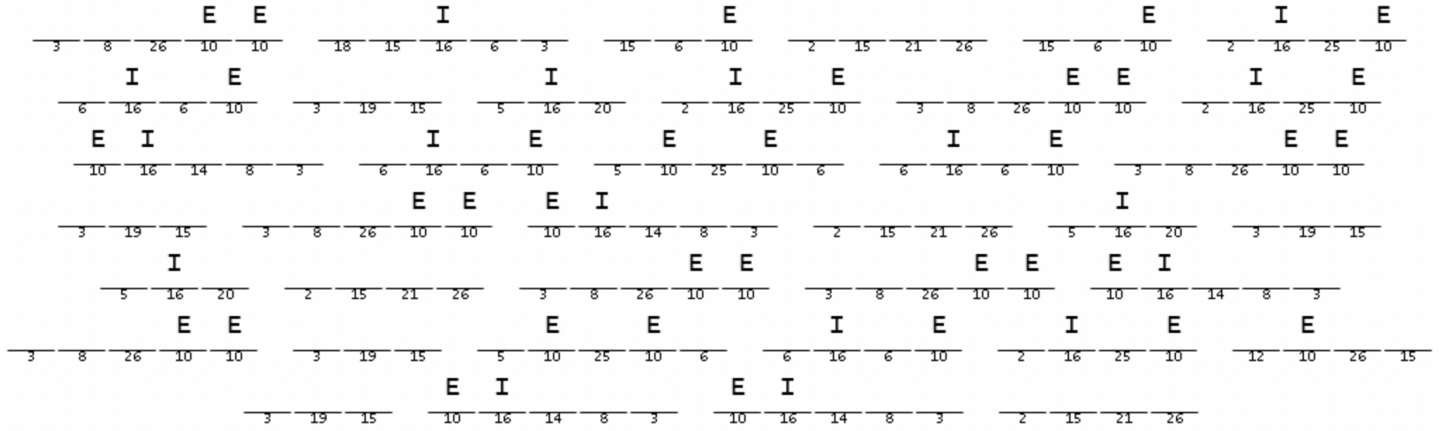

1. On this day in 1918, Woodrow Wilson signed the Standard Time Act into law, which introduced Daylight Saving Time.
