We hosted about 220 companies over the two days and thousands of students across every engineering department attended. Our Chapter also attended the 2024 National Convention in Rapid City, SD. We sent a group of 6 student delegates and 3 advisors who participated in the many sessions including professional development sessions, the National Interactive Chapter Exchange (NICE) sessions, Engineering Futures sessions, and committee meetings where they provided valuable input to the discussions despite most being non-voting delegates. Our chapter took home four awards at convention:

- The 2023-2024 New Engineering Solutions for Tomorrow (NEST) Challenge
- The Chapter Excellence Award with Distinction for 2023-2024
- The Chapter Project Award for 2023-2024 and a scholarship that accompanies it
- The R.C. Matthews Outstanding Chapter Award


