- Alaska is by far the largest U.S. state by area and the seventh largest subnational division in the world.
- It is the most sparsely populated state but by far the continent's most populous territory located mostly north of the 60th parallel, with a population of 736,081 as of 2020, more than quadruple the combined populations of Northern Canada and Greenland.
- The highest recorded temperature in Alaska is 100 °F in Fort Yukon (just 8 mi inside the arctic circle) on June 27, 1915, making Alaska tied with Hawaii as the state with the lowest high temperature.
